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

Many of you have heard of our efforts to create an endowment for our Club's scholarship program. This Forever Fund would greatly add to the Club's scholarship security and size. Traditionally the club raises about \$20,000 for scholarships, but now we are undertaking our biggest donation effort ever with the 2022 Speaker Series.

A couple dozen of our members have already volunteered to help get donations. And we are off to a great start. All of you are welcomed and encouraged to get involved. If we reach our goal, we receive an additional \$10,000 via a foundation challenge grant.

So far over 80% of the donations have come from non-members. These new donors are a welcome find for the Club. But in the end, your efforts and your financial support will be critical to making our goal and qualifying for the additional \$10,000 donation ... probably the largest in our 28 year history.

The donation is \$100 per person. It's 100% tax deductible and every cent we collect will go to this Fund. We are thanking supporters with a 4 night speaker series, at no charge, at the St. James Community Center at 7p.m. for each presentation.

Cedar Grove Mentoring Opportunities



As you know, a number of students are experiencing challenges achieving a minimum level of success in school this year. Both Brunswick County middle schools have expressed a desire to have volunteers as mentors for students one-on-one. Most often, the issue is not subject knowledge but more often can be organization, study skills, not studying or reading, etc. Positive reinforcement and review of their folders often can get the student back on track. Occasionally, we may be paired with a student that has minimal maternal or paternal involvement and being a role model and someone to talk with can be a positive outcome for the student.

For those interested, we have finalized the plans for immediate involvement at Cedar Grove from 7:42 AM until 8:27 AM in Taylor Watkin's office (she is CIS Success Coach). We will finalize South Brunswick Middle School to begin in January if we have enough volunteers. We will be guided by the CIS Success Coaches at both schools and they will train us for mentoring (which is not the same as tutoring).

One additional request from both schools is for us to be lunch period chaperones once monthly beginning at 10:48 until 12:20 (3 lunch periods) so that the teachers can relax while having their own lunch. We will need four volunteers for us to do this at each school. If interested in helping middle school students once per week, please contact Steve Corbett, 516-410-3922. Will train!

Seventeen percent of adults in BC lack literacy skills. BCLC offers programs designed to help adult learners lead more successful and productive lives. The Literacy Council has programs in basic adult literacy, GED assistance, English for speakers of other languages, computer literacy, work skills, financial literacy, and citizenship. Helping adults with literacy is much more than learning to read and write. When adults read, children become readers. If you have literate parents you have literate children.
